

# ELECTION INSPECTORS APPLICATION MORAN TOWNSHIP, MACKINAC COUNTY, MICHIGAN

Persons who wish to be appointed as precinct inspectors must be registered and qualified to vote in the county. You must apply for appointment in your own handwriting and the application must include specific information. A person shall not knowingly be appointed or permitted to act as a election inspector if the person or any member of his or her immediate family is a candidate for nomination or election to any office at the election or who has been convicted of a felony or election crime. A person shall not be permitted to act as an election inspector if he or she has failed to attend a school of instructions or failed to take an examination as provided in Section 683 (MCL168.677)
